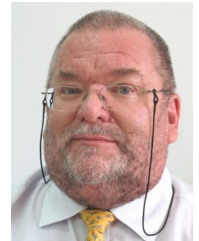
It has been an excellent start to the new academic year in Upper Primary and, thanks to the hard work from our staff and all the children, I am very confident of another successful school year.
