

Maths

This September has already seen our students take part in the exciting Fobisia Code-Breaking Maths Challenge. Our students performed admirably, scoring 628 points between them, and 36 students earned Certificates of Merit! Well done to all involved!

What's new in Maths?

Key Stage 3

Later this academic year, students in Years 7-9 will have the opportunity to explore mathematics beyond the curriculum through project-based learning, where they will examine real-life applications and apply their problem-solving skills. This will develop their critical thinking as well as their mathematics skills.

Key Stage 4

This academic year marks the introduction of both calculator and non-calculator examinations for IGCSE Mathematics and Additional Mathematics courses. While the syllabus remains largely unchanged, one of the examination papers will now include a dedicated focus on assessing students' non-calculator skills.

Key Stage 5

Thursday Morning Maths with Ms Robyn Every Thursday 7:00am 5 September - 28 November

Drop-in sessions are available for KS5 students to catch up on in-class work, revise for assessments, and resit exams. Students have been asked to sign up prior to attending the sessions. The sign-up spreadsheet has been shared with all KS5 students via Google Classroom.

FOBISIA are hosting a Secondary Maths Competition 2025 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on the 16th to 19th of January. Ms Jiin and Mr Will will lead our team of intrepid mathematicians to compete against the top students in international education.



The highly challenging Ritangle maths competition will take place throughout October and November for KS5 students. It is a team-based event where team-work plays as much of a role as mathematical know-how. Please encourage your children to sign up with their maths teacher!
